

Fire & Evacuation training (face to face)

The **Labour Act, 2007 (Act No. 11 of 2007)** legally obligates Namibian employers to ensure workplace health, safety, and welfare. This face-to-face training equips Fire and Evacuation Officers with critical skills to fulfill these statutory duties, manage emergency evacuations, and mitigate specific fire risks within the Namibian work environment.

Key regional hazards addressed in this course include:

- **Mining & Extractive Industries:** Subterranean fires, chemical explosions, and dust ignition hazards.
- **Agriculture & Tourism:** Rangeland bushfires threatening lodges, crop stores, and remote infrastructure.
- **Manufacturing & Construction:** Hot work ignition, structural collapse traps, and blocked egress routes.
- **Arid Environment Utilities:** Overloaded electrical grids and solar farm inverter thermal runaways.
